How "Our Giving" Helps Our Community: Part III

This month we continue our spotlight on ministries we support with a look at Urban Impact of Pittsburgh.

Urban Impact Foundation is a faith-based, non-profit organization that was founded by Rev. Dr. Ed Glover. He and his wife, Tammy, have been involved in urban ministry on Pittsburgh's North Side since 1986. The organization, chartered in 1995, was created to foster Christian community development on the North Side by changing lives one person, one family, one block at a time. The organization focuses on helping at-risk kids, youth, and their families in a holistic manner; i.e. by meeting needs academically, spiritually, physically and socially. Financial support comes from charitable foundations, corporations, churches and individuals.

2014 Highlights

- Reached 1,560 youth who participated in Athletics, Education and Performing Arts programs and our annual Football Clinic.
- Over 400 youth responded to the Gospel or rededicated their lives to Jesus Christ at an Urban Impact program or event. Bible studies were made available to youth in each department.
- More than 27,500 meals were served to students and families that attend an Urban Impact program, in-school activity or special event.
- Urban Impact employed and mentored almost 40 student interns.
- Over 167 businesses gave donations to Urban Impact in 2013-2014.
- More than 366 volunteers served the North Side community.
- Over 5,600 people prayed, gave or served through Urban Impact in 2013-2014.

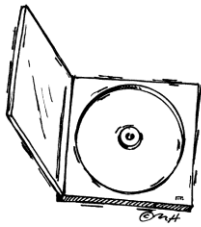

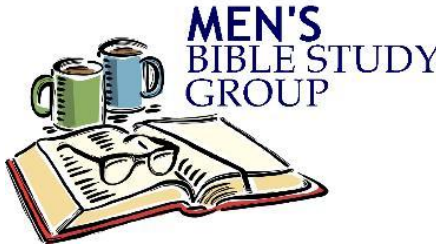

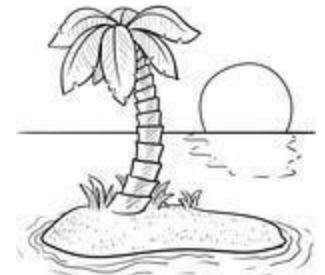
